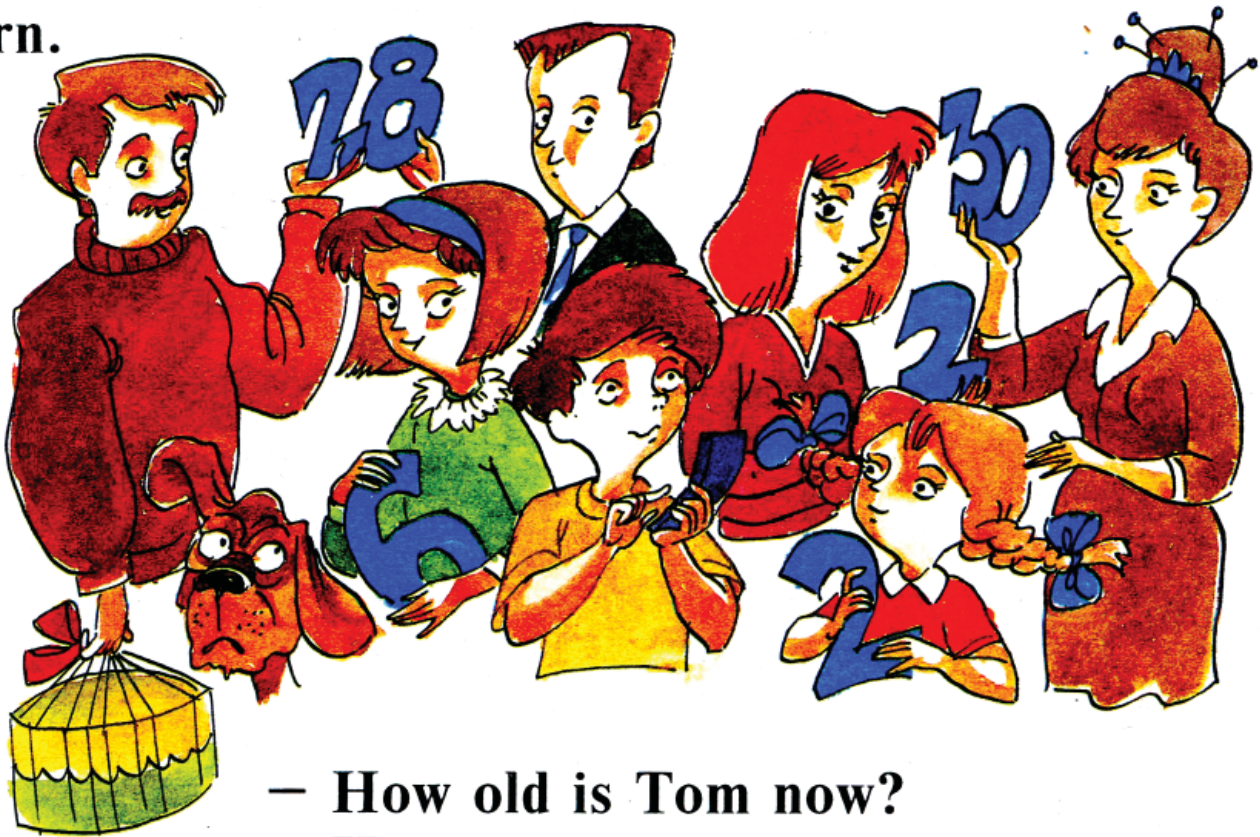


An Age Puzzle
